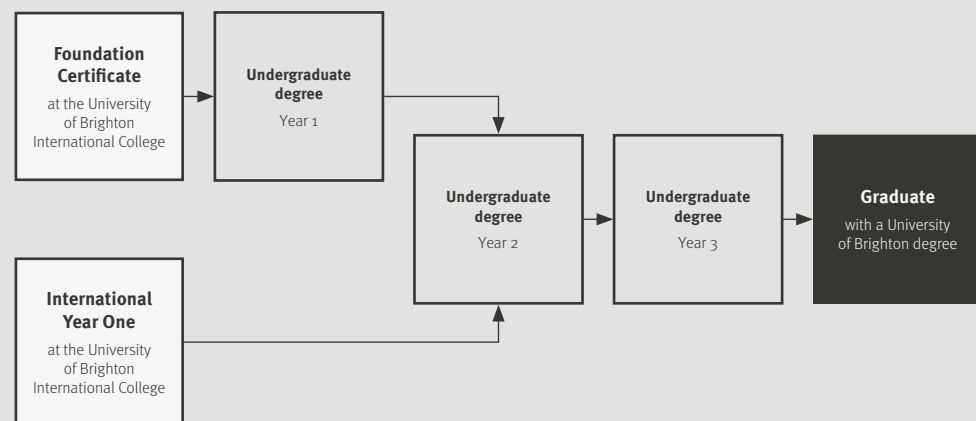

Pharmacy students: entry requirements for students progressing to a degree in Pharmacy are slightly higher than those listed above. The overall IELTS requirement is 0.5 points higher and the minimum required in all skills is 1 point higher.

Physiotherapy students: entry requirements for 2, 2.5 and 3-term courses are slightly different for students progressing to a degree in Physiotherapy. The overall IELTS requirement is the same for each course, but your score in all skills must be at least equal to the overall score.

Medicine students: progression to a degree in Medicine is only available as a 2-term course starting in September. Entry requirements for Medicine students will be IELTS 6.0, with at least 5.5 in all skills.

Pharmacy students: entry requirements for students progressing to a degree in Pharmacy are slightly higher than those listed above. The overall IELTS requirement is 0.5 points higher and the minimum required in all skills is 1 point higher.

Physiotherapy students: entry requirements for 3, 3.5 and 4-term courses are slightly different for students progressing to a degree in Physiotherapy. The overall IELTS requirement is the same for each course, but your score in all skills must be at least equal to the overall score.

Medicine students: progression to a degree in Medicine is only available from a 2-term course starting in September. Entry requirements for Medicine students will be IELTS 6.0, with at least 5.5 in all skills.

Academic entry requirements: for all course options above, you need to have completed high school at the required level. For requirements specific to your country, select your preferred degree and pathway course from our online Degree Finder: kaplanpathways.com/brighton/ug-degrees

Your course length: this is influenced by your English language score that you submit as part of the admissions process. Soon after your course starts, we'll check your English and academic level again to make sure you're on the most suitable study plan, with modules that best fit your skills and goals.
