Evaluate the styles, movements and key figures in the recent history of art, design and media, and analyse the key features and techniques they used.

Advanced Social Science

Learn about the key theories in social sciences, and their relation to methodologies in the field.

Advanced Statistics

Critique research data and apply the standard statistical tools for the analysis of research quality.

Art, Design and Media

Explore a range of materials, techniques, and processes, and develop your research, interpretation and critical evaluation skills.

Art, Design and Media Portfolio

Create the practical components which complement the theoretical and reflective work undertaken in your Research Project for Art, Design and Media module.

Art, Design and Media Research Project

Evaluate the theoretical and reflective components that will complement the practical work you produce in the Art, Design and Media Portfolio module.

Contemporary Art in Context

Review the key movements and practitioners in the 20th century within your field, considering trends within historical, political and cultural contexts.

Digital Applications

Develop your digital skill set, helping you use digital tools to support academic study, including using and citing digital sources.

Engineering, Science and Society

Gain an awareness of ethical issues and debates surrounding research and innovation in the sciences.
