Advanced Social Science

Learn about the key theories in social sciences, and their relation to methodologies in the field.

Advanced Statistics

Critique research data and apply statistical tools in the analysis of research quality.

Engineering, Science and Society

Explore and debate ethical issues surrounding research and innovation in the sciences.

English for Academic Purposes

Develop your English to the level you need for university study, and to really get involved in academic discussions.


